The Pleasantville Fire Department has implemented a Senior (Life-line) Call-In Program for our local Senior Citizens. This helps ensure their safety and well-being as well as peace of mind.

How the program works:

Members of the program will be called at the number provided daily, between the hours of 7:30 A.M.—8:30 A.M. and checked on to ensure they are O.K.

If the call is not answered by an individual on the list by 8:45 A.M. a Pleasantville Fire Department member will take the following steps to check on that individual's welfare:

- Call the individual
- Call the emergency contact(s) provided
- A Pleasantville Police Department patrol unit will be dispatched to the residence to check the well-being of the listed Senior Citizen.

Although not required, Seniors are also encouraged to provide any major medical precautionary information that may assist our officers in times of need.

If Seniors will not be home due to vacation, hospitalization, or any other long-term activities, it is important to let the Fire Department know the dates and times so that a patrol unit is not dispatched to their home.
